PA system being installed for show which can be used to give instructions and directions for any evacuation.  Emergency positions identified for all staff and Marshalls, which would assist in the safe evacuation of the show site. All staff and Marshalls briefed fully on these procedures prior to the show opening and given evacuation plan map each.  Coded message in event of emergency to be given over to tannoy, to warn all organisers and marshalls of potential problem and to ensure they go to there emergency places.  "Will Mr Enzo go to Show Control immediately"  Fire officer has been identified for the show and will be at all times in contact with show control and other organsiers by two way radio system.  All display vehicles to have engines off during show, unless prior permission of show organisers and then closely monitoured. This is detailed within show instructions sent to all exhibitors prior to show day.  All display vehicles
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Risk of Suspicious activity, terrorism or suspicious package	All persons attending ths show or present in the show ground or venue	Trained staff working for Concorde Club who are aware of security on the premises	Two Security staff will be designated to patrol the show grounds and look out for supicious activity, risks and disgarded property. They will wear floursecent vests clearly identifying them as security officers.  They will challenge suspicous activity and investigate any issues bringing them to the attention of appropraite staff. They will be reminded of the 4 C's, namely to Confirm, Clear, Communicate and Control and assist with any evacuation deemed necessary.  Only prebooked vehicles and traders will be allowed access in the show to dsiplay. A list of this will be kept and all will be required to display releavant passes. Pedestrians in front car park of Concorde Club when Dream Ride car leaves or enters car park		The Dream Rides Gazebo and cars will be positioned to the side of the ticket office. Pedestrian visitors to the show will not have to walk around the stand as it will situated to the side furthest from them on arrival.  Those donating to charity to have a ride in a 'Dream Ride' as Passengers will be accepting the offer of a ride and will complete a signed disclaimer acknowledging that liability is limited to normal passenger insurance cover.  The Rides will start and finish in a coned area by the Show entrance. This area will be controlled and marshalled by Sporting Bears members and Rotary Club Marshals. It will also be the display parking provided for the cars taking part.  Dream Ride cars arriving and leaving the site will be escorted in by a Marshal at minimum speed.  The Rides take place entirely on the public roads. Drivers will decide the route they follow and are expected to drive responsibly and obey all traffic laws including speed limits  There is no competitive or timed element to these demonstration rides  Sporting Bears Motor Club has been running this feature at the NEC Classic Car shows since 1994 and other car shows we no problems.
